“Dear God, thank you for sending your Son, Jesus, into this world. At this moment I invite Jesus into my heart to be the Savior and Lord of my life. I choose to turn away from my life of sin, and to turn to Jesus and place my trust in Him. Please fill me with the Holy Spirit so that I may live accomplishing Your will in my life. Thank you, Jesus, for dying for me so that I may live for you. Thank you for coming into my life and may I live each day as your disciple in sharing the gift of your love with others. In Jesus’ name I pray. Amen.”
